## **EQAO Primary and Junior Assessment**

Between Tuesday, May 23 and Thursday, June 1, 2017 students in grade 3 and 6 will be taking part in the provincial Assessment of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary Division. This assessment will take about six hours to complete spread over six days. Students will write one hour per day. Please make sure you schedule appointments to not conflict with this assessment period.

### **SPECIAL FOOD ORDERS**

When ordering food for our special food days parents are asked to please send separate cheques or exact money for each order. For instance, if your child is ordering pizza, wraps and Herc's please send in three different payments. Each order is put towards a different purpose and orders are sent to each appropriate class. # DRESS/APPEARANCE CODE

The Rainbow District School Board supports all schools in their expectations of appropriate student dress.

At Copper Cliff Public School, students are expected to be dressed and groomed for classes in a neat and appropriate manner.

Please note the following:

- · Clothing with offensive language or logos is not allowed.
- · Coats, hats, jackets, boots, back-packs, head gear are to be left in a designated area.
- $\cdot$  Skirts, shorts and dresses must be no shorter than the mid-thigh.
- · Clothing must conceal underwear at all times.
- · Clothing must not be revealing.
- · Students will be asked to remove piercings, jewellery or accessories if they are deemed unsafe for physical activity.
- $\cdot$  Shoes must be worn at all times. Children wearing sandals are

not allowed on the playground equipment. Running shoes are

required in the interest of student safety.

- · Children must wear clothing appropriate for activity (e.g. gym attire).
- Students are encouraged to keep electronic devices at home. The school will not be held responsible for these lost or stolen articles.
- Students may have these devices confiscated by staff if they are hindering learning or being used inappropriately.
