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A WORD ABOUT BEARS

While bear sightings are not uncommon at this time of year, there has been an increase in bear incidents. As a result, we are taking precautions to ensure that our children remain safe.

Garbage will be stored and secured so bears are not attracted to school grounds.

Staff will scan the schoolyard for bears before and during nutrition breaks. Students will remain indoors if there is a bear on school property.

We remind students to not take shortcuts through the bush when walking to and from school. We also encourage students to walk together and ask that parents/guardians reinforce these messages with their children.

As always, we will continue to be vigilant about bear sightings near our school and will notify the Ministry of Natural Resources and Greater Sudbury Police Service, as needed. ALLERGIES AND ASTHMA

We are a "peanut/nut controlled school". We ask that you make every attempt to not send peanut products to school. If your child has an allergy please contact the school to be sure that we have this on record. We also make every attempt to be a "fragrance controlled or aware school" since we have many students with asthma. Please keep aerosol cans at home as well as perfumes/colognes, etc..

The Board's practice is *not to permit* WOW butter, SUN butter, or any other peanut butter substitutes in schools. These peanut butter substitutes look, smell and taste like peanut butter. Although some parents are vigilant at labelling these as peanut butter substitutes, we cannot guarantee an effective system of checking as to whether a product contains nuts or is nut safe.

Should a student bring a peanut butter substitute to school, *the practice followed is the same practice that we follow with a peanut product.* The administration implements the Option the parent of the student with the allergy has chosen. Should a student continue to bring in the peanut butter substitute, the student and the parent should be reminded of the school's "allergen" policy.

If your child has asthma please call the school to inform the office of your child's condition and their asthma medication. In accordance with Ryan's Law 2015, your child will be allowed to carry their asthma medication with them with your permission. Ryan's Law, 2015, was passed by the Ontario Legislature and is an important step to support the well-being of students with asthma in Ontario schools.

SAFE ARRIVAL POLICY

Purpose: "A safe arrival program is a system of procedures which are performed together with daily school attendance taking. Parents and guardians are responsible for their children's safety. The safe arrival program is a mechanism that parents and schools can use to account for any pupil's unexplained failure to arrive at school." Excerpt from news release from Ontario Ministry of Education and Training February 2 1999.

Procedures:

1. Parents are responsible for communicating to the school to relate any planned pupil absences or late arrivals to school. This procedure is outlined in the school handbook and a reminder is sent home mid-year in a newsletter.

2. Parents may send in a written explanation, call during office hours or leave a message on the school's answering machine.

3. A log of calls from parents or others who report absences or lates is maintained in the office.

4. Notes from home are sent to the office as soon as possible following morning announcements. The school secretary will identify any unexplained absences that require follow-up contact by telephone.
5. Parents, guardians, and caregivers are responsible for providing the school with complete and current emergency information to enable the school to make any necessary follow-up contacts.

6. If your child needs to leave early for an appointment please communicate these details **in writing** to the teacher. If you have made alternative arrangements for picking up your child at the end of the day please communicate these details **in writing** to the teacher.

Student information sheets will be updated each school year. **Please notify the secretary of any changes at any time**.

The safe arrival program will be reviewed annually to confirm its effectiveness.

To ensure the safety of our students, we need to know when students will not be at school. If your child will not be attending school for the day, or will be arriving late, please be sure to call CCPS at 682-4721 BEFORE school begins (24 hour answering machine).
