SPECIAL FOOD ORDERS

When ordering food for our special food days parents are asked to please send separate cheques or exact money for each order. For instance, if your child is ordering pizza, wraps and Herc's please send in three different payments. Each order is put towards a different purpose and orders are sent to each appropriate class. To ensure your child receives their proper order we ask that all payments are made on time and individually so that we may avoid errors. We also ask that payments for field trips and other special events are also paid separately and not included in food payments. Thank you for your cooperation.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

In the event of inclement weather, listen to the radio for cancellation of buses and classes.

In the interest of the safety and well-being of staff and students, classes will be cancelled when weather conditions warrant such action.

To find out if schools are closed or buses are operating, please listen to the radio. Every attempt will be made to announce class cancellations on the various radio stations by 7:00 a.m.

In extreme conditions, there may not be anyone present to receive students upon their arrival. So please listen to the radio in the event of inclement weather. If schools are closed, please do not bring your child to school.

If schools are open but buses are cancelled and you drop your child off, please remember that you must pick your child up at the end of the day. If you decide to let your child remain home and they normally walk to school, please remember to notify the office.

PICKING UP STUDENTS

PARKING ISSUES

Parents are asked to obey parking signs when dropping off or picking up students. Please keep the crosswalk area free from vehicles. The crossing guard needs to have this area clear in order to assist students crossing School Street. Congestion around the crossing guard area on School Street is not safe for our children. Thank you for your assistance in keeping our students safe. After many complaints to the city from concerned parents regarding the crosswalk, please be advised that there is a bi-law that states that no vehicle can be parked within 15 meters of the school guard crossing. Tickets may be issued now that the city has been notified of the concerns.
