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### BICYCLES

A reminder to students that for safety reasons, helmets are required when riding bikes and scooters. Many of our students use a bicycle to ride to and from school. To ensure student safety, we require students to walk their bicycles onto the playground and off the playground at all times. Bicycles are to be stored in the bicycle racks and secured with locks. Please note that skateboards, scooters and roller blades and heeies are not to be used on school property for safety reasons. ### PARKING

Please be advised that there is a bi-law that states that no vehicle can be parked within 15 meters of the school guard crossing. Tickets may be issued now that the city has been notified of the concerns.

### A WORD ABOUT BEARS

While bear sightings are not uncommon at this time of year, we are taking precautions to ensure that our children remain safe.

Garbage will be stored and secured so bears are not attracted to school grounds.

Staff will scan the schoolyard for bears before and during nutrition breaks. Students will remain indoors if there is a bear on school property.

We remind students to not take shortcuts through the bush when walking to and from school. We also encourage students to walk together and ask that parents/guardians reinforce these messages with their children.

As always, we will continue to be vigilant about bear sightings near our school and will notify the Ministry of Natural Resources and Greater Sudbury Police Service, as needed.

The safety of our students is our first and foremost priority.
