All classes will start the day off with yoga stretching activities in the gymnasium at 8:45 am. A healthy snack will be provided after this event. Families are welcome to participate.

Students will then participate in school wide Mindfulness activities to help develop resiliency and learn activities that will help support a positive response to emotions. Our Junior and Intermediate learners have been participating with the Sudbury District Health Unit for a 16 week program focusing on mindfulness lessons and short mindfulness practices. These students will be sharing their learning with other classes throughout the school. Students will learn mindfulness breathing to help with self regulation. Our younger students will be paired up with older students to make breathing beads.

DRESS/APPEARANCE CODE

The Rainbow District School Board supports all schools in their expectations of appropriate student dress.

At CCPS, students are expected to be dressed and groomed for classes in a neat and appropriate manner. Please note the following:
